Dear Parents,

Please take a few moments to read this book with your child. Here are some tips to help your child become a better reader.

Before reading, look at the pictures in the book.

Listen as your child reads the story aloud. If your child has trouble with a word, help him or her figure it out by asking such questions as:

- What is the beginning sound? The ending sound?
The middle sound?
- Do you see any familiar word parts like *-ing*, *-ate*, or *-er*; for example?
- Does the picture give you a clue?
- What word makes sense in the story?

While reading, occasionally ask your child to predict what might happen next.

After reading the story, ask your child to retell the story in his or her own words.
