

### **Dear Principal:**

We want to know: Who has the best handwriting in the five boroughs? More importantly, are your students ready to show us their pencil or pen prowess?

You can answer these outstanding questions by entering the **Zaner-Bloser New York City Handwriting Contest!** This is a great opportunity for your teachers to celebrate the benefits of their handwriting instruction and for your students to showcase their manuscript and cursive skills.

Participating students have the chance to compete for the honor of representing your school as a grade-level winner. School grade-level winners are judged at the city level to be named best in their grade. These winners qualify to move on to state, then national levels, competing to be named one of nine Grand National Grade-Level Champions. Each national champion receives a cash prize and a special trophy!

The contest is open to all students in grades K–8 and includes a special-needs category inspired by a talented past participant, Nicholas Maxim. Participants who enter in this category must have a cognitive, intellectual, physical, and/or developmental disability. See the official rules for submission requirements.

### 1. Contest Rules

The contest is open to all New York City students in grades K–8. Winners will be selected from schools that use the **Zaner-Bloser Handwriting** program or **The Superkids Reading Program**. Participating schools should select and submit **ONLY ONE WINNER PER GRADE PER SCHOOL** for grades K–8. Entries should be sent to **Zaner-Bloser New York City Handwriting Contest**, PO Box 16764, Columbus, OH 43216-6764. A School Information Form must accompany all entries. Entries postmarked after **February 14, 2020**, will not be judged. Decisions by contest judges are final. Names, grade levels, and schools of winners may be posted on the Zaner-Bloser website and may be released to the media.

Employees and the immediate family members of employees of Zaner-Bloser, Inc., or its affiliates are not eligible to submit an entry, compete, or win.

### 2. How to Judge a Winning Entry

Impress upon your students the importance of legible handwriting. Give a copy of the appropriate form to each student who wishes to enter: Manuscript, grades K–2; Cursive, grades 3–4; Cursive, grades 5–8. Allow students time to practice before writing their final entry on a clean form. Remember: Handwriting should be relaxed and natural, not traced—neatness counts. Reward each student who enters the contest with a copy of the Zaner-Bloser Certificate of Participation found at zaner-bloser.com/nyc-how-to-enter.

### 3. Official Judging and Awards

All entries will be judged according to the **Zaner-Bloser Keys to Legibility—Size**, **Shape**, **Spacing**, **and Slant**—which can be found on the reverse side of each entry form. Every student whose entry is submitted to the judges will receive a School Grade-Level Winner Certificate. All schools with a winner will be notified by April 2020, so that presentation assemblies can be scheduled and all prizes can be awarded.

**New York City Grade-Level Winners**—Judges will select nine New York City Grade-level Winners, one from each grade (K–8). Zaner-Bloser reserves the right not to choose a New York City Grade-Level Winner if the entries do not meet the legibility criteria. New York City Grade-Level Winners will receive a prize package for themselves. These winners will move forward to the State Grade-Level competition.

**State Grade-Level Winners**—Judges will select a Public and Private State Grade-Level (K–8) Winner for each state. There could be 18 State Grade-Level Winners for each state, one from each grade in both public and private school categories. Zaner-Bloser reserves the right not to choose a State Grade-Level Winner if the entries do not meet the legibility criteria. State Grade-Level Winners will receive a prize package for themselves and their school.

**National Grade-Level Semifinalists**—Judges will select nine National Grade-Level Semifinalists from the State Winners. Zaner-Bloser reserves the right not to choose a Semifinalist if the entries do not meet the legibility criteria. National Grade-Level Semifinalists will receive a prize package for themselves and their school.

**Grand National Grade-Level Champions**—Judges will select nine Grand National Grade-Level (K–8) Champions. Zaner-Bloser reserves the right not to choose a Grand National Grade-Level Champion if the entries do not meet the legibility criteria. Each Grand National Grade-Level Champion will be awarded a **\$500 cash prize and a large trophy**. Each teacher of a Grand National Grade-Level Champion will be awarded an **Educator Prize Package** including **Zaner-Bloser classroom materials valued at \$1,000**. Prize cannot be applied toward an existing order.



### Contest Rules and Awards

All Nicholas Maxim Award Contest entries must be submitted in either manuscript or cursive. Entries are judged by a team of occupational therapists and educators utilizing metrics provided by the **Zaner-Bloser Keys to Legibility rubric of Shape, Size, Spacing, and Slant**. Additional consideration is given to the challenges each special needs student who enters must face with regard to their specific cognitive, intellectual, physical, and/or developmental disability. Nicholas Maxim National Champions in each category (Manuscript and Cursive) will be selected from schools that use the **Zaner-Bloser Handwriting** program or **The Superkids Reading Program**. All decisions are final.

Student entries must be submitted in manuscript or cursive using the Nicholas Maxim Entry Form.

Entries must include a letter providing specific information about your students' handwriting challenge. Letters should be submitted on school or district letterhead and signed by the occupational therapist, special education provider, and/or principal.

Nicholas Maxim entries should be sent to Zaner-Bloser New York City Handwriting Contest, PO Box 16764, Columbus, OH 43216-6764. A School Information Form must accompany all entries. Entries must be received on or before February 14, 2020. Each of the special-needs student eligible entries will receive a Participation Certificate.

New York City Nicholas Maxim Winners – From all of the eligible entries, one New York City Champion in each category (Manuscript and Cursive) will be selected. Zaner-Bloser reserves the right not to choose a Nicholas Maxim Award Winner if the entries do not meet the legibility criteria. The New York City winners will receive a prize package for themselves. Additionally, these two students will move forward in the National competition.

National Nicholas Maxim Winners – From all of the eligible entries, one National Champion in each category (Manuscript and Cursive) will be selected. The schools of the National Champion of the Nicholas Maxim Manuscript Award winner and the National Champion of the Nicholas Maxim Cursive Award winner will be notified by April 2019, so that presentation assemblies can be scheduled and prizes can be awarded to the National Champions. National Champions in each category (Manuscript and Cursive) will receive a \$500 cash prize and trophy. Each school of a Nicholas Maxim Champion will receive educational materials valued at \$1000. Names, grades, and schools of the National Champions will be posted on Zaner-Bloser's website and may be released to the media.







The size is correct when all letters of the same size are even in height and rest on the baseline.

Spacing between letters, words, and sentences should be even. Between letters in a word there should be just enough space for a minimum-sized oval. For uniform spacing between words, the beginning stroke should start near the ending stroke of the preceding word. A slanted line (45°) drawn from the endpoint of the last stroke to the baseline should touch both words. Allow enough space for an uppercase **O** between sentences and two uppercase **O**'s for the indentation of a paragraph.

Cursive letters should have a forward slant. Correct slant is achieved by positioning the paper correctly, pulling the downstrokes in the proper direction, and shifting the paper as the writing line fills.






