Evaluating your own handwriting is a good habit to form. When you see the **Stop and Check** sign in this book, stop and circle the best letter you wrote on that line.


Keys to Legibility

Start at the green dot when you trace and write.




Undercurve Strokes

On the next pages, you will write lowercase letters that begin with an undercurve stroke. Undercurves swing up.







Shape



An undercurve stroke can begin at the baseline or the midline.



Spacing

P is joined to the letter that follows. Swing wide to join to the next letter. That way your letters will have good spacing.



Use the headline, midline, baseline, and descender space as your guides.





Cursive letters have a consistent forward slant.
